## MINUTES FOR NK PARADE COMMITTEE MEETING 11/17/2020

1. Chairman Pennoyer called the November 17<sup>th</sup>, 2020 regular meeting to order at 7:00, via Zoom. Recreation Department Director Chelsea Dumas-Gibbs served as host, with the assistance of Jeannette Aylward, at the Municipal courtroom setting. Present were Bill Pennoyer, Nancy Hillner, Mary Ellen Madsen, Lou Paziienza, John Fitzgerald, Tom Spink, Mark Zaccaria, and North Kingstown Town Council Chairman Greg Mancini.
2. Pursuant to RIGL, 42-46-6 (6), notice of this meeting has been posted on the website of the Secretary of State.
3. Minutes of the October 13, 2020 meeting were approved.
4. The Finance Report was accepted, balance shown was \$2,401.43.
5. Recap of 2020 Veterans Day observance: Final drafts of Veterans Memorial Park, Town Hall, and Updike Park were placed in the Committee's permanent file. Michael Forlingieli, head of the Town's Informational Technical Department, will be asked to provide a copy of the livestreamed video to the Recreation Department which, in turn, will be put onto a flashdrive for the Committee's permanent file. These will be added to the photos to be provided by Lou Paziienza. John Fitzgerald suggested swaths of red, white, and blue material secured with clips to cover the chairs where the wreaths lay before being placed at their respective memorials. Mark Zaccaria noted that after the Updike Park ceremony, a car stopped to compliment the Parade Committee on a good job, and that they had watched the livestream of the ceremonies.
6. Plans for December 7<sup>th</sup> Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day: Because of the possible changes in policy due to the spike in Coronavirus cases, it was decided to wait until the Governor announces new guidelines before deciding how to proceed. Both live and virtual ceremonies were discussed, and the flags of the 9 states that gave their names to the battleships present at Pearl Harbor would be placed in Wickford, rain or shine, whether the ceremony be live or virtual.
7. Purchase of 9 state flags described in #6 for Dec 7<sup>th</sup> was approved.
8. Purchase of a floral wreath for Dec 7<sup>th</sup> was approved.
9. Funding request to Town Council for 2021-2022 fiscal year was approved.
10. Next meeting is set for Tuesday, May 11, 2021 at 7 pm.
11. There was no Correspondence.
12. There was no Public Comment.

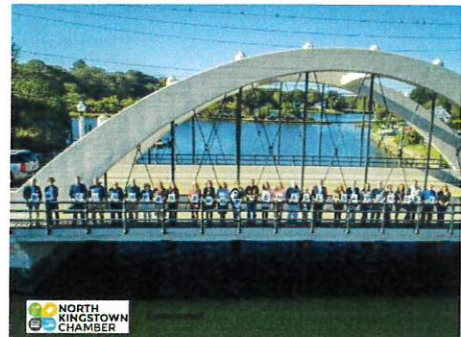
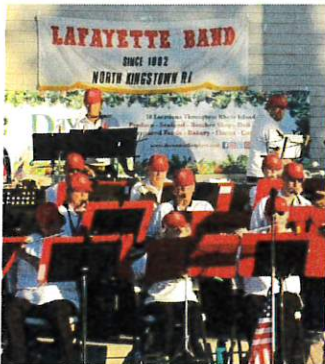
